The 20th General Meeting of The Caribbean Academy of Sciences (CAS) will be held in the beautiful island of Guadeloupe. The Biennial Conference will begin on the morning of 24th November 2016 and will finish on the evening of November the 26th with the Closing Ceremony and a Gala Dinner of French Cuisine. The venue and official accommodation, at special rates for the Conference, is the Fort Royal, Langley Resort, in Deshaies (Guadeloupe).

The theme of the Conference is :

“Biodiversity, Energy, Risks and Health”
From scientific knowledge to the emergence of innovative development strategies in the Caribbean”

One of the main objectives of the Conference is to assemble regional and international natural scientists, social scientists and engineers to deliberate and focus their thoughts on the areas identified in the theme.

A second major objective of the Conference is to provide an opportunity, via parallel scientific sessions, for experts from the region’s Universities, Research Centers and Industry to come together to present their research, industrial and developmental findings for critical analysis. The scientific program will consist of plenary lectures by invited experts and short papers of 15 to 20 minutes total duration by participants. Short papers may be in any area of natural science and social science, including Agriculture, Medicine, Veterinary Medicine, Anatomy, Physiology, Earth Sciences, Pharmacology, Chemistry, Biochemistry, Biology, Biotechnology, Energy, Food Science, Physics, Engineering, Science Education, Economics and Health Economics.

A third objective of this conference is to consider the scientific innovations carried out in the Caribbean firms. A special opening will be given to exchanges between academic researchers and industrial or consulting firms.

We encourage all researchers with interest in the Caribbean to submit their original research and wish to all a very fruitful event.

Publication Policy

We are happy to inform participants that along with the Biennial Conference, CAS and the Caribbean Journal of Sciences (CJS) will edit a special issue of CJS. The CJS publishes original research, review articles or essays, and book reviews relevant to Caribbean natural science. The emphasis is on botany, zoology, ecology, conservation biology and management, geology, archaeology, and paleontology. The CJS has 0,353 of impact factor ranking (2014-2015). We invite all participants to submit their original research papers. Submissions will be externally peer-reviewed. For more information please contact the co-editors Pr O. Preparation of Posters

Posters should be a maximum of 84 x 112 cm (33" x 44"). A maximum of two posters per person will be allowed. The following information should appear on each poster:

- a. Title
- b. Poster number (As assigned)
- c. Name(s) of Author(s)
- d. Name of each Author's Institution
- e. Abstract
- f. Introduction
- g. Methods
- h. Results (including Tables and Figures)
- i. Discussion
- j. Conclusions
- k. References

Preparation of Abstracts

Abstracts for each oral and poster presentation must be submitted via electronic mail by the **10th of October 2016** at cas2016@espe-guadeloupe.fr

Abstracts must be typed to fit on a single sheet of letter size paper (8.5" x 11") using Times New Roman in Microsoft Word 2008.

Typing should be fully justified with one-inch margins at the top and at each side; a minimum of one-inch must be left at the bottom of the page. The entire abstract, including title, name of the author (s), affiliation (s), and text should be typed within these limits.

The Abstract title should be centred and **bold**, "title style", in Times New Roman (12-point font). On the next line the Author(s) name(s), (11-point font, **in bold**) should be written as initial(s) followed by family name(s). Author(s) name(s) must be centred and separated by semicolons, underlining the name of the person who will present the paper. On the next line, the institution(s) of the author(s) must be typed in italics and centred. When authors originate from different institutions, the authors and the institutions should be numbered using superscripts to the top right of the names and the top left on the institutions. The body of the abstract (**without any sub-headings**) should be in 11-point font and should start two line spaces below the institutions identification. The text should be typed using one and a half line spacing with one extra space separating paragraphs. Paragraphs should not be indented.

It is suggested that abstracts include: A definition of the problem, a working hypothesis, main methods or techniques employed, results, discussions, conclusions and Keywords.

***Colwellia* and sulfur-oxidizing bacteria: an unusual dual symbiosis in a *Terua* mussel (Mytilidae: Bathymodiolinae) from whale falls in the Antilles arc.**

Abstract

Seven individuals of a single morphotype of mussels (Bivalvia: Mytilidae) were found attached to naturally sunken vertebra collected in Guadeloupe (Caribbean) at 800m depth. These specimens resemble small *Idas* mussels which are found worldwide at cold seeps and hydrothermal vents, and harbour ectosymbiotic bacteria on their gills upon which they depend for nutrition. Based on multi-locus gene sequencing, these specimens appear to belong to a new species closely related to two species now included within the genus *Terua*. Unexpectedly, its closest relatives are found in the Pacific, questioning how this species has reached the Antilles arc. Based on marker gene sequence analysis, electron and fluorescence microscopy, *Terua* n. sp. harbours two distinct and abundant extracellular bacterial symbionts located between microvilli at the apical surface of host gill epithelial cells. One is a sulfur-oxidizing bacterium similar to the symbionts previously identified in several deep-sea mussels, meanwhile the other is related to *Colwellia* species, a group of cold-adapted heterotrophic bacteria able to degrade organic compounds. This study provides the first evidence for the existence of a dual symbiosis in mussels from whale fall ecosystems in the Caribbean. The evolutionary history of *Terua* n. sp. and potential role of its *Colwellia* symbionts are discussed.


